A Note From Our Pastor

You are about to embark on a study of one of the most meaningful and important aspects of the Christian life: baptism. For more than two thousand years, followers of Jesus Christ have willingly and faithfully participated in two ordinances that celebrate what God has done for us: communion and baptism. Both of these ordinances remind us of the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 11:23-26; 15:3-4; Romans 6:3-5). Communion is celebrated on an ongoing basis and baptism is a one-time personal faith response of devotion to God.

This resource is designed to offer clear and straightforward answers about the most commonly asked questions people have about Christian baptism. In putting this guide together, the foundational question we have asked along the way is, "What does the Bible say about baptism?" Therefore, many of the scriptures about baptism are printed for you to read. Other scriptures are simply referenced by book, chapter, and verse. To receive the most from your study, we encourage you to read each passage cited.

One question you may have up front is this, "When I'm ready for baptism, what is my next step?" Our process for guiding a person to the moment of their baptism has been designed to be both simple and meaningful.
