5. If you are married, did you write your own vows or did you use traditional vows?
6. How important are marriage vows? Why?
7. It has been said that feelings follow actions. Can you give an example of how you have seen this to be true?
8. What was the most difficult thing for you to hear from this message? Why did you find it to be difficult?
9. What has been the most helpful thought/idea from the message this week? How has that thought/idea helped you?
10. How can the group encourage you this week?
