



Bring It: Pt. 7; The Rich Fool

As followers of Christ, we have to recognize that all possessions belong to God and that we are called to trust in God's provision rather than material wealth. When we are generous towards God's Kingdom, we build wealth that has an eternal significance.

Bottom Line: Your generosity has an eternal impact on God's Kingdom.

Discussion Questions:

1. Name three things that bring you joy. What is it about these things that make the list?
2. What would you say are your top 3 priorities in life right now?
3. Think about the average week in your life. How do you typically spend your days? Do these activities align with the priorities you mentioned in question 2? Why or why not?
4. **Read Luke 12:13-21.** What is your initial reaction to the parable of the rich fool? How did Jesus' response to the man's request for justice surprise you?
5. How do you see the issue of priorities playing out in your own life? Are there areas where you might be prioritizing possessions over spiritual matters?
6. Read this sentence and then respond to it, "If death can take it away, it's not yours, it belongs to God."
7. What things might you be holding on to that ultimately belong to God? What practical steps can you take to remind yourself that everything you have belongs to God?
8. What are some ways you can invest in the kingdom of God that have eternal significance?
9. What has been the most helpful thought/idea from the message this week? How has that thought/idea helped you?
